

Norman Jay Landerman-Moore Profile

Born the oldest of nine children, Norm was raised in the Imperial Valley desert and Northern Sacramento Valley, and Sierra Nevada Mountains of California.

In 1957, Norm and seven high school buddies, joined the United States Marine Corps where he served in a Recon Unit with the 1st Marine Division, 5th Regiment, attaining the rank of Sergeant.

After Military service Norm attended California State Polytechnic University, graduating with a Bachelor Degree in Urban Planning. He undertook graduate work in Urban Economics at Purdue University and studied law at Pacific Coast University in Southern California.

Norm was Chief of Planning and Development for City Sciences Corporation directing development of California Park, an 8,000 acre planned community. He served as projects manager for Genge Corporation, focusing on economic development projects in California and Texas. He was invited to join a planning team with the Arabia American Oil Company at Dhahran, Saudi Arabia organizing infrastructure, housing and commercial development plans within the Arabian Peninsula. Upon returning to the United States, Norm was interviewed by then Governor Ronald Reagan and accepted a Career Executive appointment as Chief of Planning with the State Resources Agency.

After Governor Reagan became President, Norm resigned his appointment and opened a planning and economics consulting practice serving public and private clients in the United States and abroad. After 35 years of service, Landerman-Moore Associates was retired this past year.

Norm and his wife Mary call Anacortes, Washington their home. Both are engaged in genealogy. Norm serves in Public Affairs with the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and enjoys the association of his four children, ten grandchildren and one great grandchild.
